Senior Vice President

Since the meeting in Philadelphia in February, I have participated in a number of areas of responsibility. On March 2, I attended a meeting in Washington DC involving Amtrak Chief of Corporate Relations Clifford Black along with Walter Zullig, Metro Region RVP, and Denis Connel, Railpace Magazine, concerning photographers and their rights to photograph trains. Despite the meeting, Amtrak produced guidelines that generally restrict photographer's rights.

I assisted the preparations for the Audit Committee meeting with Greg Molloy, Robert Heavenrich and Joseph Hefron. Much of the contributions included the work with RailCamp and membership issues.

During the period, I have been active addressing the problems several chapters experienced with communications and reporting problems with Fernley & Fernley. Specifically, I assisted Connecticut Valley, Delaware Valley, Inland Empire, Quebec City, British Columbia, North Alabama, and Bluewater Michigan with specific problems. Several chapters made individual contacts with minor problems which were cleared quickly. The contacts have ranged from e-mail messages to personal telephone calls. I communicated with both Christina Rockwell and Kristen Olszewski during this period.

While the President was on vacation, I handled a number of routine issues and coordinating the distribution of reminder notices to the members of chapters who had renewed 75% or more of their membership. Chapters who have not renewed 75% still will receive reminder notices or offers to transfer membership to at large status when chapters have failed to respond to contacts from the staff at Fernley & Fernley and the national officers.

I participated in the 50th Anniversary Celebration at the Harrisburg Chapter on April 4, 2009. The chapter is one of the most active in NRHS and the banquet was well attended.

RailCamp Program

All the RailCamp planning is moving forward and the status is commensurate with the plans at this point in past years. The teenage programs at Steamtown and Nevada Northern are just about complete. Steamtown has 18 campers registered while Nevada Northern has 4. As of April 14, twelve chapters have indicated that they will provide scholarships for campers. Several have still not identified campers and are looking for campers to assist.

The Adult programs have benefitted from the large advertising campaign in Trains Magazine. As of April 15, the Adult Program in June is over-subscribed with a waiting list. The September program has four people registered.

Bulletin Officially Back on Schedule

For the first time in nearly ten years, the *NRHS Bulletin* has officially returned to a normal publication schedule.

The **Fall 2008** issue, the final regular *Bulletin* of the 2008 issue year, went in the mail on April 6, 2009. The **Winter 2009** issue, the first regular Bulletin for 2009, was mailed on April 13, 2009. The **2007** *NRHS Yearbook*, the final 2008 publication, was delivered to the post office on April 15, 2009. All members in good standing for either the membership year 2008 or 2009 should have received all three of these publications before the end of April.

The **Spring 2009** issue is currently in layout and the final staging of editing, and it is expected to be in the mail about June 1. Content is currently being selected and edited for the **Summer 2009** issue, with expectation that it will be distributed to the membership around August 1st. The **2008 Yearbook** (part of the 2009 *Bulletin* year) is currently being laid out and a late summer distribution is anticipated. While the three publications mailed in April went to all 2008 members regardless of renewal status, the rest of the 2009 *Bulletins* will be mailed to ONLY those members who have renewed their memberships for 2009.

Now that the publications are back on a regular schedule, members can expect to see the *Bulletin* quarterly with mailings in March, June, September and November, plus the *Yearbook* in late summer.

NRHS President Greg Molloy congratulated *Bulletin* Editor Jeff Smith for his hard work and perseverance in bringing the publication back from a significant schedule deficit. This achievement was especially impressive because the *Bulletin* was returned to schedule without skipping or combining any issues, and both the *Bulletin* and the *Yearbook* were expanded to a full-size format with high quality photo reproduction in the process. Mr. Molloy noted that this schedule improvement would not have been possible without the improved contracting practices made possible by the Society's new membership dues levels that started in 2008.

Editor Jeff Smith said he would like to thank the many people who contributed to getting the *Bulletin* back on schedule since we started the current catch-up plan with the Winter 2005 issue. First were our contractors Steve Barry and Jim Boyd who together produced seven issues of the *Bulletin* between their day jobs and other projects. Next up is Kevin EuDaly and his team at White River Productions who produced five issues of the *Bulletin*. Our volunteer staff deserves a standing ovation for putting in countless years into making the *Bulletin* the professional publication it is today as well as producing four issues of the *Bulletin* during the catch-up period. Then there are the people who rarely get recognized but without whose efforts the *Bulletin* would never get in the mail. This group includes: Carol Berguson and the crew at Grit Printing, Lynn Burshtin, Christina Rockwell and the team at Fernley & Fernley and the NRHS officers and staff. Finally, we should thank the group of content contributors who allow the pages of the *Bulletin* to contain something other than white space. Special thanks goes to Tom Garver, Howard Ande, Elrond Lawrence, Jim Boyd, George Drury, Tony Reevy and many other regular contributors who graciously took time to generate content to fill the pages of the *Bulletin*.

INSURANCE REPORT APRIL 15, 2009

After meeting with Brandon Grizzel our insurance agent from New Castle Insurance Agents in Delaware last November, I again met with him on March 17 to finalize our insurance coverage for the year.

The policies cover liability insurance for the organization and specifically for the several board meetings and the membership meeting held each year and to cover the value of the library now in storage and the painting which NRHS owns and which is displayed at Fernley and Fernley. The policy covers the papers in the collection for \$ 100,000, the books for \$ 108,000, the artwork for \$ 10,000 and the films for \$ 28,000.

They also provided Directors and Officers Insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 for the Board and the Officers should they be sued by Membership for Bad Business Practices or other related failures or alleged failures

Finally the policies covered liability for all of the Rail Camps scheduled for this coming Summer at both Steamtown, Scranton, PA and at the Nevada Northern Railway at Ely, Nevada. These policies included insurance for all our vendors involved at Rail Camp. Coverage limit is at \$2,000,000 aggregate for personal injury and \$50,000 for fire damage

Please note that we still do not have enough information from the Convention Committee to determine what if any insurance needs NRHS has for the trips and the convention which it is sponsoring in Duluth. General Counsel is working with the Committee to determine that as soon as possible and to acquire coverage if required.

The total cost of insurance to date for the coverage year is \$ 10,047.00 for all insurance paid for. Breaking it down, Rail Camp 5934.56; liability \$ 3288.00; Directors and Officers \$ 825.00.
