

Meeting Minutes NRHS Board of Directors Clarion Hotel, Cedar Rapids, IA Thursday, June 21, 2012

Pursuant of notice, the Board of Directors of the National Railway Historical Society, Inc. met at the Clarion Hotel in Cedar Rapids, IA, Thursday, June 21, 2012.

Call to Order

President Gregory Molloy called the meeting to order at 2:34 p.m. CDT on Thursday, June 21, 2012.

Invocation and Welcome

Senior Vice President (SVP) Barry Smith led the Directors in an invocation.

Roll Call

Secretary Joe Maloney explained the process for taking attendance at the meeting. Because the registrations received from Board members were relatively low for this meeting, Secretary Maloney conducted a roll call and subsequently confirmed that there was a quorum in attendance with 121 weighted votes attending. The list of voting Directors, National Officers, Service Directors, Members, and Guests present or excused at this meeting is Appendix A to these minutes. The list of those absent is Appendix B to these minutes.

Volunteer Reporting, Confidentiality and Conflict of Interest Agreements

Secretary Maloney announced that he had extra copies of the Confidentiality Agreement and the Volunteer Reporting Agreement for those people who needed to sign them. No one reported any conflict of interest at this meeting.

National Directors Requiring Dues Renewal

Secretary Maloney reported that all National Directors have paid their dues for 2012.

Mia Mather moved and Duane Durr seconded a motion to seat the alternate directors for this meeting. Motion carried.

Approval of Minutes

Secretary Maloney advised that he had received two corrections to the draft Spring 2012 BOD Meeting Minutes. On page 3, General Counsel's report – change "2011" to "2012." On page 4, Convention Reports, Cedar Rapids, IA, change "2013" to "2012." Duane Durr moved and Wesley Ross seconded a motion to accept the draft minutes as corrected. The motion carried.

Presidential Appointment

President Molloy announced two (2) appointments. Kurt Bell has been appointed to the Railway Heritage Grants Committee, and Elrond Lawrence has been named as Public Relations Director.

President's Report

President Molloy asked John Hankey, Henry Posner and Matt Schulte to provide some brief overviews of their perspectives concerning railway heritage preservation efforts.

John Hankey, a railroad historian and former director of the B&O Railroad Museum, stressed the need for the railway history preservation community to start being more of a community. We need to define what constitutes railway heritage. He pointed out that ARM and TRAIN are in the process of consolidating into the Association of Tourist Railroads and Railway Museums.

Henry Posner, Chairman of the Iowa Interstate Railroad told the Board that NRHS has serious demographic problems going on. He went on to point out what the industry might be interested in seeing from NRHS to work jointly:

- 1) Safety and security
- 2) National policy level concerns about re-regulating railroads
- 3) Industry demographic challenges the railroads are doing a lot of hiring
- 4) NRHS ought to relook at its mission and look forward

Matt Schulte, Executive Director of the Steamship Historical Society of America, hopes to collaborate with more with NRHS.

President Molloy thanked all those in attendance, and the members that have done so much work organizing this meeting. He asked the Board to thank Bart and Sarah Jennings and all those who have assisted in this convention.

NRHS-Sponsored Insurance Program: President Molloy introduced Dan Roddy, from HMBD Insurance to give us an update on the NRHS-sponsored insurance program. Mr. Roddy read a letter that accompanied a check for \$2002, which is an unrestricted donation to NRHS from HMBD equal to 5% of the premiums paid on NRHS-sponsored insurance over the past year.



Reports of National Officers, Service Directors, and Committee Chairs

Railway Heritage Grants Committee: Don Bishop and Mia Mather reported the recipients and amounts of the grants for the 2012 NRHS Railway Heritage Grants Program. Go to http://www.nrhs.com/news/2012 heritage grants. They thanked President Molloy and the affected Regional Vice Presidents for their timely review of the grants applications.

Secretary & Membership Awards: Secretary Maloney and President Molloy presented a charter reinstating the Rochester Chapter to David Luca. Secretary Maloney also reported that he attended the Susquehanna Valley Chapter's 50th anniversary celebration in April, and would be attending the Gulf Curve Chapter's 25th anniversary celebration in July. Alabama Gulf has gone defunct, and the remaining three affected chapters, Arkansas-Boston Mountains, North Jersey, and Rochester, have not yet advised NRHS about their anniversary plans.

Senior Vice President Report: Barry Smith reported on the results of his recent, very productive meeting with several chapters' Electronic Billing Contacts. Concerns about the current process and the design of the dues bill were discussed and fixed.

Executive Director Study Group: Jack Hilborn reported on the results from the June 4, 2012 committee meeting held in Chicago, IL, and a conference call that Walter Zullig and he conducted with several Fernley & Fernley executives in late-May 2012.

Railroad Photography: Walter Zullig reported on rail photography security concerns. Isolated problems continue to come up from time-to-time. PATCO issued new guidelines for their security personnel which are well written. NS has started a program to actively engage the rail fan community as additional eyes and ears for safety and security akin to BNSF and Amtrak programs. Walter Zullig advised that CSX and NS police may be getting more aggressive in dealing with photographers trespassing on railroad property.

NRHS Discount Program: Wesley Ross thanked the organizations participating in the 2012 discount program. The list is in the latest edition of the *NRHS News*, and is the largest list ever. There was no report for Operation Lifesaver.

Emblem Sales: Dave Baniewicz reported that he had sold more than \$2000 in NRHS items at this convention, and encouraged people to buy T-shirts.

Convention Reports

- Tacoma, WA President Molloy reported that there is no final financial report due to some remaining open financial issues.
- Cedar Rapids, IA (June 18-24, 2012) President Molloy reported that registration numbers from NRHS members are below those of recent conventions, but we have sold many tickets to local people, over eighty of whom also joined NRHS. Bart Jennings, 2012 Convention Chair, reported that overall sales are strong; costs are at or below budgets, so we should expect a better financial performance than what was forecast at the Spring 2012 Board of Directors' Meeting. This year, out of the 660 registrations in early June, 604 people opted to have their tickets mailed to them ahead of time. Likewise, over 85% of the registrations came from the on-line option rather than mailing in a paper form with a check. The Board gave Bart Jennings a strong round of applause for his successfully executed convention with its several business innovations.



- Anchorage, AK (September 18-22, 2013) President Molloy reported that plans are well underway, and introduced Ms. Kathie Evingson, Visit Anchorage, Ms. Helen Renfrew, Fairbanks Convention & Visitors Bureau, and Mr. Patrick Shake, Alaska RR Vice President for Transportation and Mechanical. Convention dates are on the NRHS web site, with trips starting in Fairbanks, AK on September 14 & 15, 2013, a two-day trip from Fairbanks to Anchorage with an overnight stop at Denali National Park on September 16-17, 2013, and the convention events based in Anchorage, AK September 18-22, 2013. Letters of intent with the host hotels have been signed, and firm contracts should be signed soon. The hotel should start taking reservations sometime in October or November 2012. Event pricing should likewise be complete by October or November 2012.
- 2014 and beyond No change in status since the Spring 2012 Conference.

NRHS Conferences

Bob Bitzer reported on the upcoming NRHS Conferences and Board of Directors' meetings.

- Fall 2012, Claymont, DE (October 19-21, 2012) Bob Bitzer reported that the meeting hotel will be the Crowne Plaza on Naamans Road in Claymont, DE outside of Wilmington, DE. The room rate will be \$89 plus taxes. There will be a rail event on Friday, October 19, 2012, possibly in Philadelphia, PA. The new Board of Directors will meet on Saturday, October 20, 2012, and the Advisory Council will meet on Sunday, October 21, 2012. Several directors commented that the Advisory Council should meet first, followed by the Board of Directors. President Molloy advised that NRHS management would review the meeting schedule and announce it shortly.
- Winter 2013 There are no specific plans for a Winter 2013 Conference at this time.
- Spring 2013 Scott Andes from Cincinnati Chapter proposed the Spring 2013 Conference that would be co-sponsored with the Collis P. Huntington Chapter in Cincinnati the weekend of April 4-7, 2013. The host hotel would be the Marriott with a room rate of \$119 per night plus tax, which would include a hot breakfast buffet. There are several potential rail event venues in the area. Wesley Ross moved and Steve Barry seconded a motion to accept the joint bid from Cincinnati and Collis P. Huntington Chapters to co-host the NRHS Spring 2013 Conference. The motion carried.
- Fall 2013 There are several venues under review, but no proposal to bring to the Board.

Bob Bitzer continues to look for sponsors for 2014 conferences and beyond.

Reports on Society Initiatives

RailCamp – Barry Smith reported that both 2012 RailCamp venues are fully subscribed. He thanked Ed Berntsen, Bill Chapman and Ed Thompson for their extensive work on behalf of RailCamp.

Dues Renewal Process for 2013 – Barry Smith had nothing to add to his previous meeting report. The NRHS office needs this year's chapter dues information in early July 2012 to avoid delaying NRHS sending out the 2013 dues notices on time.

Status of 2012 Elections – Secretary Maloney provided a presentation updating the Board on the status of the elections. (See Attachment 1) Balloting closes on August 1, 2012. The General Counsel and Interim Electoral Committee will certify the election results later that month.



Unfinished Business

Executive Committee - President Molloy reported that the Executive Committee had met twice via email since the BOD Meeting in Richmond, VA. The first discussion was to approve NRHS reinstating the Rochester Chapter. The motion to approve was, "The NRHS Executive Committee, acting on the delegation of authority granted by the Board of Directors meeting Sunday, April 22, 2012 in Richmond, VA, approves the act of reactivating the Rochester Chapter, NRHS, and issuing said chapter a revised charter. The reactivated chapter has 34 members, with Mr. Rand Warner, 58 Park Circle Drive, Fairport, NY 14450 as National Director." The Executive Committee approved the motion via email on April 26, 2012.

The other discussion was to review and approve the details of the Fall 2012 Conference. The Executive Committee approved those details via emails on June 5-6, 2012.

Budget for 2012 - 2014 - President Molloy reported that NRHS Management had no recommended changes for the 2012-2013 budget. NRHS is holding off some discretionary spending to help with cash flow. The two big unknowns at this point are the 2012 convention outcome and 2012 donations, most of which come in late in the year.

Dues Adjustments for 2013 – President Molloy read the motion introduced at the Spring 2012 Board of Directors' meeting concerning a proposed dues increase starting in 2013. That motion was, "Starting with the 2013 membership year, NRHS membership dues rates will be increased as follows:

- At-Large Primary increased from \$37 to \$40
- Chapter Primary increased from \$36 to \$39
- No change to discounted rates for Student or Youth
- No change to Family rate
- Standard event-related promotional rate increased from \$24 to \$25."

None of the National Directors who were not present at this meeting sent Secretary Maloney any votes in absentia. After some discussion, the Board voted on the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

New Business

2011 Audit Report: President Molloy reported that he had received the draft audit report two weeks ago, so the audit report is complete. There is a technical error in the financial tables that Bob Heavenrich is addressing with the auditors. The audit report is not complete, since that is something President Molloy will write after the auditor's documents are finalized. The technical issue in the tables does not impact the overall financial results, so we will be using soon to be completed audited numbers in the 2012 Annual Meeting.

Review of the 2011 IRS Form 990: President Molloy is reviewing the draft IRS Form 990, and said that it will be sent to the Board for review in early July. It will be posted to the password-protected portion of the NRHS web site. No Board of Directors' action is required.

Withdrawal of Charters of Defunct Chapters: Secretary Maloney reported chapter charters are to be revoked when NRHS receives no dues from a chapter, and there is no response to any written communications. After receiving no response to follow-up letters sent on May 4, 2012, Secretary Maloney moved and Becky Gerstung seconded a motion to withdraw the charters for the Alabama Gulf and Ozarks Chapters. After discussion, the motion carried. The remaining members from those former chapters will be converted to At-Large members.



Limit Length of Conventions: Duane Durr moved and William Dredge seconded a motion to limit the length of NRHS conventions to no more than four (4) days. After discussion, Al Weber moved and Paul Hopkins seconded an amendment to the original motion that the incoming Board of Directors consider shortening the conventions as a suggestion. The amending motion carried. After more discussion, the Board voted on the original motion as amended. The amended motion was defeated.

Announcements:

Henry Posner announced that ball caps for the lowa Interstate Railroad are for sale at \$20 apiece.

Benediction: Barry Smith gave the benediction.

Adjournment: Duane Durr moved and John Sweigart seconded a motion to adjourn. The motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 5:56 p.m. CDT.
