

Draft Minutes of the NRHS Advisory Council Holiday Inn Airport Hotel – St. Louis, MO Saturday January 11, 2014

Scott Andes - Advisory Council Chair Pro Tempore, presiding member. Call to order at 8:00AM CST

Welcoming remarks by Scott Andes and Al Weber

NRHS Vice President Joe Maloney designated Scott Andes to continue as Advisory Council Chair Pro Tempore.

Roll Call (Appendix A)

NRHS Secretary Bob Ernst introduced Ellen Pinsky who distributed the attendance sheets for the meeting.

Bob reported no Alternate National Representatives were appointed for the meeting.

Minutes of Previous Meeting

One error was corrected in the draft minutes from the 2013 Fall AC Meeting. Changed Three Rivers, PA to Three Rivers, MA.

Motion

Del Kittendorf moved and Robert Murray seconded to approve the minutes of the 2013 Fall Advisory Council Meeting as corrected. Passed by voice vote.

Report from National Office

President Greg Molloy stated that dues renewals are at 53% which is similar to numbers from last year's renewals at this time. Some large chapters have no renewals to date.

Old Business

Kurtz Bylaws Motion – tabled from the 2013 Fall Conference.

Jon Baake motioned and Del Kittendorf seconded to bring up the motion up for consideration. Passed by voice vote. The recommendation will be presented to the Board.

Chapter Newsletter Exchange

Jeff Smith will present a report at the 2014 Spring Conference.

Chapter Representative Job Description

Scott is asking for volunteers to create a committee to write the job description of a National Representative. Fred Kurtz and Jon Baake volunteered to be members of this committee.



Proposed Dues Collection System

The Advisory Council discussed the report on the Proposed Dues Collection System Option B. The discussion was based on the report distributed for the 2013 Fall Conference and the teleconference meeting held on January 4, 2014. The Proposed Dues Collection System report and teleconference question and answer report are posted in the AC section of the admin website. Many members of the Advisory Council participated in the discussion.

Highlights of the discussion included:

Cost of the check surcharge

- The fee is extreme and should be reconsidered.
- The fee will cause a decline in membership.
- Use a discount to the dues for using the online system instead of a fee.

Many members are not computer savvy.

- Older members will not use the online system.
- Some members will refuse to give out an email address.
- o Members depend on the paper notification for dues renewals.
- Chapters can designate a person(s) to assist fellow members who are unable to use the online system.

Implementation

- Phase in the process over a couple of years.
- A phase in would be a better PR move.

Greg Molloy discussed the importance of reducing the cost of renewing members.

Jeff Smith discussed and clarified the mechanics of the new process. National will be issuing renewals for National dues only and chapters will be responsible for issuing their chapter renewals. Jeff also discussed that credit card security will be compliant with the latest laws and no credit card information will be stored.

NRHS Members Open Microphone

Robert Freeman commented on the Chapter Information area on the website. His chapter's information is incorrect even with the spreadsheets being updated. Jeff Smith will discuss this with Robert.

Del Kittendorf discussed how the Advisory Council can be proactive on membership recruitment. The chapters need to help each other to stop the membership attrition. Greg Molloy noted that the NRHS has a vacant Membership Development position, a position rarely filled. He is looking for assistance in this area.

Ron Gawedzinski asked on the status of the NRHS Strategic Plan and how are we going to make our organization attractive to younger members. Jeff Smith commented that some items are being completed but a good number of items have not been started. The plan must be updated. Gary Reinbolt



noted that it is important to continually update a strategic plan based on current conditions of an organization. An update is in progress and will be presented later this year.

Jon Baake is requesting a status of the Strategic Plan on a point by point basis from the Board with some measurable results.

Wes Ross urges the Advisory Council members to be more involved in NRHS programs. Because of the lack of volunteerism, dues are being increased because there is a need for more paid services. The Advisory Council can become more proactive in helping to find volunteers.

Del Kittendorf is inviting the Advisory Council members to join the Yahoo Group and will assist anyone who wants to join the group.

New Business

Scott Andes is seeking a new Secretary for the Advisory Council since the current Council Secretary Bob Ernst has become the NRHS Secretary. There were no volunteers among the attending group and the item will be on the 2014 Spring Conference agenda.

Jon Baake Discussion Points (Appendix B)

Jon Baake is requesting to put the points up for discussion to the Advisory Council for action. This will placed on the 2014 Spring Conference agenda for more discussion and to start actions. Jon talked through each of the points to explain his reasoning. There were multiple positive comments to Jon's points.

Feedback to the Board of Directors

Carl Jensen suggested to the Advisory Council that a statement should be made to the Board regarding the Proposed Dues Process.

Motion

Carl Jensen moved and Ed Graham seconded that the Advisory Council agrees there needs to be a change to the dues process but does not endorse the punitive aspects impose on those who cannot use the online service. The process should have a way to assist those members who require the use of checks and a manual process. After additional discussion the motion passed by voice vote.

Upcoming Conferences

2014 Spring Conference

Mark Eyer invited the Advisory Council to the 2014 Spring Conference on April 24-27, 2014 in Lewisburg, PA. A registration form was distributed to the group. Mark outlined the weekend's activities.

2014 Convention

Greg Molloy presented information on the 2014 Convention schedule. He is recommending the Advisory Council meet on Thursday, June 12, 2014 in the evening.

Robert Murray moved and Del Kittendorf seconded that the Advisory Council meet during the 2014 Convention on Thursday, June 12, 2014 at 8PM. Passed by voice vote.

Appendix B

Discussion points for the Jan 11 Advisory Council Meeting

- 1. Communications, Communications, Communications. Nothing is more important than improving communications with our chapters and members. Email is ubiquitous and we should use it to the maximum extent possible. Continue the push to get email addresses for all members not just through the chapters but also through all other mailings. Establishing and maintaining the email list can be expensive but is a cost of doing business in this electronic age. Send the *Telegraph* to all NRHS members who have given us their email address and have opted in to receive it.
- Publish summary financial statements in the News (pie charts showing income and expenses
 could be useful) and detailed financial statements and the annual audit report in the
 Telegraph.
- 3. Encourage chapters/chapter members to become more engaged with National, by among other things, becoming active in the Advisory Council and serving on NRHS committees. I know attempts to do this have not resulted in the desired response. Enhanced personal contact from National may improve this. Establish a committee to make recommendations on ways to improve the response.
- 4. Provide a report on the health of each of our chapters at BOD and Advisory Council meetings. Regional Directors would be responsible for obtaining current chapter health information. The idea is no one should be surprised when we hear a chapter is disbanding, or worse, doing quite well but just opting to disaffiliate with the NRHS. Ask Regional Directors to comment on chapters at risk at BOD meetings.
- 5. Conduct a survey of members and chapters that have left over the last three years to find out why they left and what it would take to bring them back. Establish a committee to construct and conduct the survey and analyze responses to determine things we could be doing differently or better.
- 6. Establish a new class of organization membership for museums and RR Attractions who would see a benefit in affiliation with the NRHS. They would not be chapters per se and NRHS membership would not be required for members of these organizations. This would put the NRHS more in front of the public and may gain membership where the public did not know we existed. There would have to be real benefits to those organizations that would choose to affiliate and we would have to charge a fee for the privilege of NRHS affiliation. Establish a committee to study this concept in depth and make recommendations to the BOD.
