2016 RailCamp Dates, Locations and Applications Announced

Application for 2016 RailCamp will be posted January 1, 2016.

The success of the program depends on the participation of campers. We are asking all chapters to get involved with this amazing opportunity for young people. Spread the word through your newsletter, create a sign to post at your meetings or take with you as you attend train shows or public displays and programs. Applicants do not have to belong to the NRHS to be accepted into the RailCamp program.

NRHS Press Release, Monday, December 14, 2015 - The National Railway Historical Society (NRHS) has announced the dates for its 2016 RailCamp. The annual unique program RailCamp offers а railroading opportunity to high school students, providing hands-on training in oldest America's and most important industries.

RailCamp is an educational experience designed to teach students about 21st century railroad operations, dispatching, and maintenance while providing a simultaneous experience in the early history of U.S. railroads in the development and settlement of our country.

Students will learn both modern and historic elements of America's most vital transportation mode, including how diesel, electric, and steam locomotives function, how track is built and maintained, and how early freight and passenger cars were constructed. With a focus on the ways in which revolutionary technical changes in modern railroading affect today's business, students will participate in railroad operations, interact with railroaders, learn

about preservation techniques, experience railroad history, obtain career opportunities, and work with real railroad equipment.

Two different camp opportunities are offered during the summer months:

- June 26 July 2, 2016, RailCamp East, Newark, Delaware – Amtrak will host students at its High-Speed Rail Training Facility and National Operations Center in Wilmington, DE. Campers will also spend two days in Strasburg, PA at the Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania and the Strasburg Rail Road.
- July 31 August 7, 2016, RailCamp Northwest, Tacoma, Washington – Students will visit Amtrak's King Street Station in Seattle, WA and its adjacent maintenance facility. Campers will also visit the operations center of Tacoma Municipal Belt Line (Tacoma Rail), The Northwest Railway Museum at Snoqualmie, WA, and the Mount Rainier Scenic Railroad at Mineral, WA. Additional time will be spent at Seattle's Sound Transit commuter rail facility.

The program is open to high school boys and girls who are currently freshmen, sophomores, juniors, or seniors (class of 2016). Individuals who enter their freshman year in 2016 will also be eligible to participate. Applicants do not have to be NRHS members to attend. NRHS 2016 Railway Heritage Grants Announcement

The NRHS is again awarding grants to support railway history and the preservation of railway heritage this year. Applications must be submitted electronically by 5 p.m., March 1, 2016. (See details below.)

In 2016, several individual awards will be made for amounts up to \$5,000. The NRHS reserves the right to fund grant requests partially. The form for Application with Terms and Conditions and Instructions can be found and downloaded on the NRHS.com website.

Who is Eligible? Projects involving the preservation, restoration. interpretation, or stabilization of historic railroad resources and materials will be considered, as will projects that plan for the same. Projects that support publication, research, outreach, and education are also encouraged. Applications should indicate how a project will catalyze community involvement, coordinate multiple sources of and produce support, long-lasting outcomes.

New components of ongoing projects which were the subject of a previous NRHS grant are eligible.

Match Requirements. All grants require a 50/50 or 1:1 match with AT LEAST half of the required match being cash. Up to one-half of the required match may be in-kind expenditures of labor and material directly and specifically benefitting the project. Labor expended on the project, whether paid or volunteer, can be counted toward the in-kind portion of the match at a maximum rate of \$15/hour. Materials may be valued at their retail price.

Non-eligible Projects. Not eligible for funding are routine maintenance of restored vehicles, running maintenance or repair of restored artifacts that exhibit wear from regular use, or inadequate protection,

or have reached the end of their service life.

Purchase of computer equipment and software is also not eligible for funding. Funding is not available for work already completed before receipt of the grant and for work undertaken elsewhere.

Applicant Organizations. Eligible projects must be submitted by nonprofit 501(c)(3) history organizations such as museums, historical societies, preservation organizations, historic sites, libraries, archives, or other history organizations that are located in one of the fifty states or the District of Columbia that actively engages in railway history and operations. Proof of 501(c)(3) status is required.

Entities that do not have 501(c)(3) status as determined by the Internal Revenue Service should seek fiscal sponsors as coapplicants municipalities, who are 501(c)(3)municipal entities, or organizations whose missions are in keeping with the work the applicant Fiscal sponsors who have proposes. 501(c)(3) status whose missions are in keeping with NRHS-funded projects often include local NRHS chapters, historical societies, preservation advocacy organizations, and church, youth, and civic NRHS 2016 Railway Heritage Grants organizations. Announcement Grants applied for in partnership with NRHS chapters are encouraged.

Note: Under limited circumstances when there is a compelling reason, the 501(c)(3) requirement can be waived. Applicants who do not have 501(c)(3) status and who cannot reasonably find a fiscal sponsor should state why that is the case. Eligible applicants may only submit one grant request per calendar year. Applicants that have received a Railway Heritage Grant for two (2) consecutive

years must wait a period of one year before submitting another application. *Award Criteria*. Grant awards will be based upon the following criteria and conditions:

- The proposed project contributes to the preservation of, and increases the general knowledge and understanding of railway history.
- The proposed project is original in scope or a new component of an ongoing project for which a grant was previously received. Duplication of past efforts must be avoided.
- The proposed project will catalyze community involvement, coordinate multiple sources of support, and result in long-lasting positive outcomes.
- The proposed project timeline for completion of the project, or completion of a new component of an ongoing project, shall not be longer than two (2) years from receipt of the NRHS grant.
- The proposal must satisfy the required match.
- Plans for maintaining the restored artifact or building shall be in place.
- Membership in the NRHS is not a prerequisite but will be strongly considered as a tie-breaker between two equally acceptable proposals that are finalists.

How to Apply. Applicants shall submit a signed, scanned grant application electronically to grants@nrhs.com. Applicants for and recipients of NRHS Railway Heritage Grants are deemed to agree to the Terms and Conditions which is part of the application form.

GRANT APPLICATIONS MUST BE ELECTRONICALLY SUBMITTED NOT LATER THAN 5:00 P.M. PST (8:00 P.M. EST) - TUESDAY, MARCH 1, 2016.

Hotel is the Holiday Inn, Denver East - Stapleton. Rates are \$99.00 per night plus tax for 1-2 people in a room. A 20% discount will be offered in both restaurants in the hotel to registered guests of the hotel.

- Monday, July 18, 2016. Registration Room open 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- Tuesday, July 19, 2016. Chartered buses to the Royal Gorge Route with lunch on board this wonderful dome train.
- Wednesday, July 20, 2016. Three trips this day go to different events.
 - Trip #1. All day trip over the new and existing light rail and heavy rail lines in the Denver metropolis area.
 - Trip #2. Heritage Tour to the History Colorado Center and the Denver Art Museum.
 - Trip #3. Tour to the Forney Museum of Transportation and the Platte Valley Trolley line and finally a visit to the Caboose Hobbies store.
- Thursday, July 21, 2016. Tour by chartered buses to Georgetown Loop Railroad and then to the Colorado Railroad Museum. The entire facility is chartered for our group. Buffet lunch included at their new lunch facility on the grounds. They have 2 operating narrow

gauge steam locomotives operating that day. Rides are included for this tour.

Thursday late evening is the annual Night Photo Shoot for up to 50 photographers. This includes a chartered bus from the hotel to the museum. This is a separate cost event.

- Friday, July 22, 2016. This is a day in the hotel for meetings and seminars. That afternoon is the annual NRHS Membership meeting. The annual banquet is that evening with a cash bar prior to the event.
- Saturday, July 23, 2016. Chartered buses take our group up to ride a chartered train on the Leadville Colorado & Southern Railroad. We operate rare mileage to include the Climax part of the line which is not part of the regular tour. Box lunch is included in this package.
- Sunday, July 24, 2016. Chartered buses will take us on a special outing. We hope (but do not guarantee) to view the UP steam engine #844 on its deadhead move from Denver to Cheyenne. (The #844 is expected to operate on the Cheyenne Frontier Days train on Sat. July 23, 2016 for invited guests only.) On the day's return trip, we stop at the Fort Collins Trolley Museum.
