We are having serious problems with the company that provides the database service that we use for keeping our membership records. They want us to switch to using their untried, unproven payment service in place of the well known PayPal that we use right now. We are unwilling to make the switch. We will likely change to a new database provider within the next few months. I apologize to all of those who have had difficulties with the on-line renewal system. Most of this is simply a part of their efforts to force us to accept their new payment system. We will not change. We will pursue what we believe to be the right answer for the NRHS.

Currently, some Chapters have Officers who are "Chapter Only" members, and not members of NRHS National. Please ensure anyone who is proposed for election to a Chapter Office is, in fact, a Member of the National organization. The NHRS has changed the bylaws to permit "Chapter Only" members. However, they are not permitted to be Chapter Officers. Any Chapter may request a list of the Chapter Members who are Members of National. Please contact me (membership@nrhs.com) and I'll be happy to provide it.

Please remember (and remind your chapter) that the NRHS is very protective of Members' privacy. We do <u>not</u> allow the use of our Membership List by any other organization. Also, we do not sell, rent or permit access to the database. When we issue Membership lists, we do so carefully. When sent to registered officers of the National Organization, please protect the lists with confidentiality. Chapters may request lists of their own members. Also, I will send to Chapter Officers lists of "At Large" Members who live close to their meeting place. Please help to protect and respect with our member list as well.

In 2020, RailCamp East is June 21-27 in Newark, Delaware and RailCamp Northwest is July 26-August 2 in Tacoma, Washington. Application deadline is April 1, 2020. Each RailCamp is open to persons aged 14 – 18 who enter ninth, tenth, eleventh, twelfth grade, or have graduated from high school in the year of the camp.

March 31, 2020 – Candidate Nominations for 2020 NRHS Election

The 2020 election is the fifth election being conducted under the revised NRHS Bylaws. Nominations for candidates will be open from January 1, 2020 through March 31, 2020. In this election, affected officers and Board members will be elected to four year terms. We have provided the details about the election process, and the qualifications for candidates are contained in the NRHS Bylaws. These are on the Admin site at https://admin.nrhs.com.

The Electoral Committee is now soliciting members who wish to run for these offices. Any and all NRHS members who meet the qualifications and wish to run should contact Joseph P. Maloney, Jr. at vp@nrhs.com so that they may be placed on the ballot. If you have any questions regarding qualifications for office, please advise Joseph P. Maloney, Jr. at vp@nrhs.com. Please note that all nominations for any NRHS office must be in the possession of the NRHS no later than March 31, 2020.

The National Railway Historical Society, Incorporated (NRHS) is conducting its national elections under the procedures outlined in the NRHS Bylaws as revised and adopted January 13, 2013. Per the revised Bylaws of the NRHS, the NRHS Board of Directors consists of 25 members.

Two (2) members hold the office of NRHS President and NRHS Vice President; five (5) members are Global Directors; and the remaining eighteen (18) members are District Directors. There are seven districts for the chapter members, and two districts for the At-Large members.

This year, for the first time since the current NRHS Bylaws went into effect, we have several NRHS officers and Directors who have reached the "end of the line" because of the Bylaws' term limits. The following NRHS officers and directors may not run for office in this upcoming election: NRHS extends its thanks and sincere appreciation to these members for their time and commitment to the effective operations of the Society.

All NRHS members in good standing, as of April 11, 2020, will elect the Vice-President and two (2) Global Directors. Global Directors represent the entire NRHS membership. Members must be 12 years of age as of June 13, 2020 to be eligible to vote in this election.

As a member in good standing, you will also elect one (1) district board member based on the district you are assigned. Districts are determined if a member is a chapter member or an At-Large member. Chapter members are assigned to one of seven chapter districts, Districts 1 through District 7, based on the geographical location of your home chapter. For chapter members, this means that you may be assigned to a different district from your residential address because you live in another part of the country compared to your home chapter's For At-Large members, your assignment is based on your residential location to either District A or District B.

The Electoral Committee for the 2020 election consists of Valli Hoski, Roberta Ballard, Bob Ernst and Joseph P. Maloney, Jr., with legal support from John K. Fiorilla, NRHS General Counsel. The committee is responsible for the entire election process which includes the approval of qualifications of candidates, and oversight of the election

process to assure that schedules and procedures adhere to the NRHS Bylaws and laws of the State of Maryland.

Barry O. Smith (1942-2019) Former NRHS Senior VP

Barry O. Smith, EdD, 77, formerly of Chambersburg, PA, passed away on Saturday, December 21, 2019 in Green Ridge Village, Newville, PA. Barry was NRHS Senior Vice-President and member of the Cumberland Valley Chapter, NRHS.

Dedicating his life's work to the field of education, he earned his BSEd from Bloomsburg State College in 1964, a MSEd from Bucknell University in 1969 and an EdD from Temple University in 1979. Barry taught in the Pottstown SD from 1964-1966, then moved to the Norwick SD from 1966-1977 where he taught math and physics and held the positions of middle school principal and assistant to the superintendent. In 1977, Barry moved to the Midd-West School District as assistant superintendent and superintendent. He finished his career as an associate professor Shippensburg at University from 1989 to 2000 and worked as a hearing officer for special education from 1991-2008.

Surviving are his children, Jeffrey Smith of Sunbury, PA and Cindy Smith-Parr (Andy) of Blacksburg, VA; grandson, Jacob; brother, Terry Smith of Harrisburg, PA and companion, Sandy Cones of Newville.

A Celebration of Life Service will be held on Saturday, April 4, 2020 at 11:00 AM in Green Ridge Village, 210 Big Spring Rd., Newville, PA 17241with a visitation one hour prior to the service.
